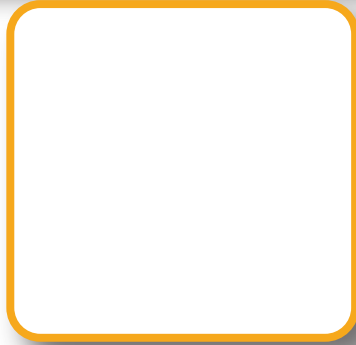


Portrait of a Lubbock ISD Prekindergarten Student



MATH

During Prekindergarten, students will...

- count to 30.
- recognize numerals 0 to 9.
- name and create common shapes and identify number of sides.
- sort by various characteristics and describe how objects are the same and different.
- recognize and create patterns.
- use objects to add and subtract up to 5.
- use location words such as "over/under", "near/far", etc.
- count 1-10 items, with one count per item and name the total amount.
- identify verbally 1-5 objects without counting.

Students entering Prekindergarten will work toward becoming:

Lifelong Learners who are curious

Leaders who are positive and share ideas

Responsible Citizens that respect authority and the rights of others

SCIENCE

During Prekindergarten, students will...

- observe and describe what happens during changes in the earth and sky identify and compare earth materials and their properties and uses.
- observe, describe, and investigate properties and characteristics of common objects such as wood, paper, cotton, plastic, etc.
- identify and describe characteristics and life cycles of organisms.
- investigate and describe position and motion of objects.
- investigate and describe sources of energy, including light, heat, and electricity.

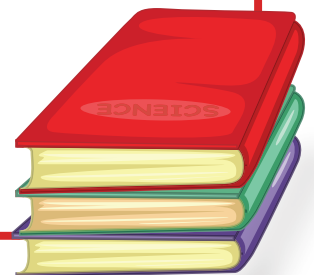

ELAR

College and Career Readiness:

- locate explicit textual information, draw complex inferences, and analyze and evaluate the information within and across texts
- compose a variety of texts
- apply listening as an individual skill and as a member of a group
- develop effective speaking styles

Social Studies

- gather, organize and display the results of data and research
- identify and analyze main idea, point of view, and situate information into appropriate contexts
- analyze interaction between human communities and the environment
- evaluate different government and economic systems

Digital Learning:

- manipulate a mouse to select objects and open and navigate through software programs
- listen and interact with onscreen programs such as storybooks using a touch screen or a mouse
- follow multi-step directions
- engage with, imitate, repeat the information from the computer/tech games to extend knowledge and enrich learning

Home Connection:

- read books to your child daily
- sing songs and recite poems and rhymes
- practice drawing and writing
- practice writing name
- cut paper with scissors to improve fine motor skills
- practice counting objects to 10
- practice counting to 30
- vote for simple family decisions
- identify community helpers
- identify the Texas flag and United States Flag

ENGLISH / LANGUAGE ARTS / READING

During Prekindergarten, students will...

- follow three-step directions.
- engage in conversations in appropriate ways using conversational rules.
- use a wide variety of words to label and describe.
- use a large speaking vocabulary, adding several new words daily.
- use complete sentences of four or more words.
- ask to be read to or asks the meaning of written text.
- recognize rhyming words.
- produce words that begin with the same sound.
- combine sounds to make words (/m/-/om/=mom).
- blend syllables into words (Mon-day/Monday).
- name upper and lower case letters.
- recognize and produce the correct letter sounds.
- read 20 high frequency words.
- retell or re-enact a story after it is read aloud.
- use beginning and ending sounds when writing.
- write first name in proper sequence.
- write top to bottom/left to right.
- experiment with punctuation.

SOCIAL STUDIES

During Prekindergarten, students will...

- connect their life to events, time and routines.
- discuss roles and responsibilities of community workers.
- demonstrate that all people need food, clothing, shelter, family care and money.
- explore geography tools and resources such as maps and globes.
- engage in voting as a method for group decision-making.
- identify the flags of the United States and Texas.

SOCIAL EMOTIONS

During Prekindergarten, students will...

- use positive communication to build relationships and solve problems with others.
- show initiative in independent situations and persist in attempting to solve problems.
- manage own behavior.
- understand the difference and connection between emotions/feelings and behaviors.
- stay on task during engaging group activities.
- assume roles and responsibilities as a part of classroom community.
- appropriately initiate social interactions.
- show empathy and caring for others.
- understand that others may have perspectives and feelings different from his/her own.
- sneeze into elbow.
