

Byron Martin ATC Declaration of Interest CERTIFIED PATIENT CARE TECHNICIAN COURSE

In order to fully prepare you for the course training and expectations involved in a professional course, there are things you need to know! First, we have fun and we work hard!

Here are a few details about the course you should know:

- 1) You have the opportunity to earn national certifications in the areas of patient care, electrocardiography, and phlebotomy. Here are some descriptions of the roles each plays in healthcare:
 - a) Patient Care Technicians provide bedside care to patients, including assisting with basic activities of daily living, linen changes, blood sugar checks, vital signs, and more.
 - b) EKG Technicians acquire recordings of patient heart activity and recognize next steps from the ordering provider.
 - c) Phlebotomists obtain blood samples by puncturing into the vein or capillaries. They collect, document and prepare samples for transport to the laboratory for testing.
- 2) Each area has its own standards and requirements in order for the candidate to sit for the certification examination.
- 3) We attend clinical sites in order to get real hands-on experience, meaning you work with real patients in the hospital or outpatient setting. You will be expected to act professionally at all times.

Here are some tips to be successful:

- 1) Communicate, communicate, communicate!
- 2) Be prompt and in attendance
- 3) Comply with professional standards outlined by the program and facilities you enter
- 4) Do your assigned work and turn it in on time
- 5) Be inquisitive and ask questions

There are medical documents and disclosures you will need to have turned in during the first weeks of school in order to comply with minimum requirements to enter clinical rotation sites. If you do not submit these documents by the deadline, you may be transferred out of the program. Below is a basic list of documents needed; it is subject to change due to policy of the hospital or facility at any time. Read through each section and initial your understanding, along with a parent or guardian:
