

O.L. Slaton Middle School Standardized Dress Policy

Students will be expected to come to school the first day of classes in standardized dress. In addition to the O.L. Slaton Standardized Dress Policy, students are also expected to follow the Lubbock ISD Dress Code Policy included in the Code of Conduct.

Tops

- Polo-type, solid color, collared shirts – red, grey, or black. 8th grade students may wear light blue collared shirts to show support for their status as future Monterey Plainsmen.
- Long or short-sleeved undershirts must be a solid white, black, or grey. • No decorative stripes, designs, or patches on polo shirts or undershirts.
- No brand logos larger than a 1 1/2 inch x 1 1/2 inch square area.

Bottoms

- Pants, capris, shorts, or skirts – in khaki color.
- Shorts/Skirts must be approaching the knee – length should not be shorter than 2” above the knee.
- Girls may wear black or white tights under their skirts in cool weather.
- There should be no designs, colors, rips/holes, logos, or patches on pants, capris, shorts or skirts.

Accessories

- Students may wear any jacket or hoodie. Jackets may have hoods, but the hoods may not be worn during school.
- Shoes are required. No roller shoes or house shoes. Some classes may have special shoe requirements.

Spirit Attire

- Monday -OLS Spirit Day- Students may wear O.L. Slaton or Monterey shirts with their khaki pants. All other standardized dress policies are in effect.
- Friday - College Day - Students may wear any university shirt with their khaki pants.

LISD code of conduct also includes the following:

- Oversized clothing shall not be worn. Specifically, students are not permitted to wear sagging or baggy pants. Pants must be worn at the natural waistline.
- Tattoos on a student must be covered
- The neck opening on any type of shirt or blouse may not exceed the equivalent of the second button below the collar of a dress shirt or blouse.
- Jewelry that depicts weapons, drugs, or profanity may not be worn.

- The hair shall be clean, well-groomed, and shall not cover the eyes and the hairstyle shall not create a classroom distraction or make a reference to or possibly be interpreted as gang related.
- Mohawks, faux hawks and extreme hair colors are not permitted.
- Sideburns shall be kept trimmed so as not to form a beard, and shall not be extreme in fullness.
- Mustaches shall be acceptable if neatly trimmed and beards are not acceptable.
- Students may not wear facial studs, facial rings, or tongue bars, and body piercing must not be visible, nor may it be extreme or disruptive.
- Male students in Pre-K-8th grade may not wear earrings.
- Spacer earrings, gauges, and plugs are prohibited.
