Choirs

6th Grade Treble Choir: Licentia Militum (Freedom Knights)

This is our 6th grade soprano/alto choir. In this class, we focus on the foundations of singing.

This includes sight reading, solfege, performing, technique, and musical elements. No previous music or choral experience is required to join.

6th Grade TB Choir: Knights of the Kingdom

This is our 6th Grade Tenor/Bass choir. In this class we will focus on the foundations of singing. This includes sight reading, solfege, performing, technique, and musical elements. No previous music or choral experience is required to join.

7th Grade SA Choir: Coro de los Caballeros (Choir of the Knights)

This is our intermediate 7th Grade soprano and alto choir. We will be focusing on polishing the elements learned in 6th grade and singing harder music.

They will learn compete at UIL competition in the spring with the choir.

8th Grade Choir: Song Birds

This is our top choir. In it is all of our eighth grade sopranos and altos. Focus areas of learning include all of those of the 6th and 7th grade choirs but more detailed. They will also learn about vocal technique and singing in more popular styles. They will compete as a choir in UIL held in the spring. Previous experience is not required but it is preferred for this class.

All-Call Choir

This is our afterschool choir that meets twice a week. It is open to all voice types and grade levels. Areas of focus for this choir include learning music literacy, how to sing popular music as a choir, musical elements, technique, and solfege.
