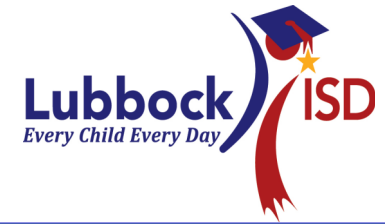

Vocational training opportunities available for Lubbock I.S.D. secondary special education students:

- Microcomputer Evaluation of Careers & Academics (MECA) includes 54 career exploration and assessments that give students training and job skills experience.
- Project Discovery-12 career exploration curriculum that provides hands on experience.
- 185 hands-on task boxes: matching, stacking, sorting, fine motor, assembly, packaging and job training.
- Phillip Roy Life Skills curriculum
- Unique Learning System
- Laundry service for the district provides towels for the Pete Ragus Aquatics Center.
- Document destruction for the district and private businesses.
