- Each grade will now be assigned a specific organization with which you will work throughout the year
- Half your total grade-level goal is required to come from the assigned organization
- If you find your passion for serving with your particular assignment, you may certainly work more than half your hours with them
- Available dates/times to volunteer during the school year are already set ~ all you have to do is sign up for the date(s) that work for you

- You will be responsible for setting that up if you are interested in doing so ~ the phone numbers and contact names are listed

How Will I Capture 'Focus' Hours?

- When you submit hours in x2vol, you will now see that your grade level will have 2 goals for the year:
 - Grade assigned organization
 - General service goal

Make sure to submit your hours in the correct goal!

- General hours can include activities such as the Cumberland Pumpkin Patch, working with LISD schools, Night To Shine, or any other opportunities given throughout the year or during the summer

What's the Same?

— Please remember to still submit your hours within 2 weeks of your service, even during the summer! Additionally, watch for verification from your activity contact. Do not be concerned about approval, but rather verification!
