Welcome and Introductions

Members in attendance: Paulett Rozneck, Katherine Wells, Nancy Trevino, Christa Ritchey, Stacy Carter, Jennifer Fornari, Susan Perez.

Members introduced themselves. There were 22 TTUHS 2nd degree nursing students in the audience. Meeting started at 12:05pm

Approval of Minutes – unable to approved due to no quorum

Old Business

- A. Wellness Plan – Lori Johnson was not available. Will transfer forward to next months meeting for update

New Business

- A. Prevention of Child Abuse, Family Violence, Dating Violence, Sex Trafficking, Suicide and Suicide Prevention – SB 9 (policy provided at meeting)
- B. SB 11 – policy to be provided via email

Stacy Carter presented information about Senate Bill 11 (Suicide Prevention and Awareness). Recently videos were shown to K-2, 3-5, 6-8, 9-12 grades covering age-appropriate required information about signs of suicide, ways to get connected to help, as has been done the last 4 years. For this school year, the videos were updated. New videos were reviewed and approved by a committee. Videos have been available on the Lubbock ISD safety website. There were numerous comments and complaints this year. Some negative feedback linked to misinformation on social media posts. Changes were made to the video because of questions about drug and alcohol abuse. Younger students get information about kind words, seeking help, and being a hero.

This is a concern due to the need to address these topics, supported by the current numbers of outcries in local schools. It was stated that from August 17 to September 13, there have been 73 threat assessment generated. September is suicide prevention month.



Suggestion was to send out parent letter prior to students watching video, mirror parent and student information, utilize CATR with TTUHS to assist with education, first response mental health training for all staff, K-5 use cartoons or kids from within LISD, use terms that all can understand. Ideally, safety team wanted the videos shown and then follow up with counselors to do guidance sessions with classes to engage students and address questions/concerns.

Next meeting in October will focus primarily on suicide and prevention and compliance with SB 11 requirements. Stacy will send to Paulett the following information to be shared with members prior to meeting: sample parent letter sent to principals for distribution at their schools, Dr. Rollo's letter in response to complaints, summary of complaints, link to videos, copy of Senate Bill 11. Possible resources, Jason VanAllen, Nancy Trevino, PTA president, fellow child-adolescent with TTUHS. Stacy Carter will also share what Safety has done, definitions, signs/symptoms and how to get help, how to learn to assess and handle difficult situations and conversations. The meeting will be extended to 1:30pm

November meeting will talk about Senate Bill 9 and ask for representative from Voice of Hope, Child Advocacy Center representative, DA Sunshine Stanek.
